Pat McManus provided a brief update on the Superintendent's Search.

Lori Cunningham questioned the Final ByLaws; the 20 or more changes requested by the Board were not included.

- Tab 3: 0113- the address is incorrect.
- Tab 4: 0123- Item G (standards for boardmanship. Encouraged in accordance with the Sunshine Law encourage ongoing communications among Board Members- the Board, students, staff and the community.

By Laws - 0170 -

Page 2 states that the Board will evaluate how policies have been implemented and their effectiveness. It will rely on such metrics as summaries. Consensus given to change the word 'will' in both first and second sentences to 'may'.

NEOLA suggested that two hard copies of the policy books be maintained (one in the Superintendent's Office and the second in the School Board office) and all others will be on line.

The requirement under Implementation states The Superintendent 'will' provide for a comprehensive plan to engage parents.... and the plan 'will'.....

Wendy Dodge, Legislative Liaison, reported there is a parental involvement requirement in the School Improvement Plans. Mr. Harris commented if there is not a requirement for each school to evaluate their plan's effective, then a policy would not be necessary. Consensus reached to add 'District' to the second sentence...The 'District' plan will provide for annual evaluation....

Mr. Harris questioned the identity of 'The Superintendent of Public Instruction'. NEOLA clarified that it refers to the Commissioner. Consensus reached to change the title to Florida Commissioner of Education or designee.

NEOLA stated that most districts do not include this section - it is NEOLA's template. It is not required by law.

Mrs. Sellers is concerned that information under "A" allows 'prior to the creation and approval....members of the community are provided an opportunity to make recommendations on the operation and funding of the program.' Consensus was to remove "A" and change title to Before/After School Care.

Mrs. Sellers questioned the validity of "G".

The settlement agreement requirements have been met; magnet schools are no longer required. However, if they cease to exist, federal dollars may be in jeopardy. Harrison is a Choice school on Lakeland High School's campus; yet we don't transport Veterinary students which is also a choice program on the same campus.
 - Mrs. Cunningham supports families applying for any magnet/choice school regardless of where they live, if they provide the transportation.
