Superintendent's Report

46. <u>Superintendent's Report</u>

Minutes:

The next work session will be held on Tuesday, February 25, 2014 at 12:30 PM in the Superintendent's Conference Room followed by the School Board Meeting at 5:00 PM held in the auditorium located at 1915 S. Floral Avenue, Bartow.

Superintendent LeRoy provided a snapshot on the mid-year status report in the major achievement areas of the Strategic Plan. The document contains approximately 101 measurable outcomes. Leading indicators were used in the areas of Reading, Mathematics, Writing, and Science. The goal is to move the District from a 'C' to an 'A' within the next five years. The achievement data shows we are on the right track. Measurable outcomes were coded in Green, Yellow, and Red: Green indicates that we have met or exceeded the target (44.7%); Yellow means we are fastly approaching the target (27.77%); and Red means more work is needed to reach the target by the end of the school year (27.7%).

• Using baseline data (50% on the FCAT) and the state's FAIR Assessment, more

students are reading on grade level and continue to make progress. High School 11th and 12th graders that have not passed the FCAT and who continue to struggle will have other opportunities to pass alternative assessments (ACT, SAT or PERT) to graduate.

- Math data shows that Grades 3-8 in Algebra 1 and Geometry are making significant gains.
- Science data is in yellow; the biggest concern is the predictability or confidence in the district assessment tool being used (Discovery). Last year's FCAT data has a 20% gap with the District's assessment data.
- Writing is in red; requirements have increased at state level and held at 3.5. As a district, we are not at the 3.5 level.

Superintendent LeRoy praised the work of the teachers and students; because of their hard work, we are absolutely making learning gains.

Mrs. LeRoy provided information on the district-wide and community-wide reading initiative for K-12: Power up Polk!

Priorities are:

- 1. Increasing reading proficient
- 2. Closing the achievement gap
- 3. Improving the graduation rate
- 4. Improving community partnerships

The Reading Imperative: Every PCSB student must be a proficient reader.

Power Up Polk will increase PreK-12 reading achievement through District support, professional development, community engagement, and communication to include a city-wide community and marketing plan.
