Minutes:

Don Wilson, Attorney for Superintendent, reported that the facts of the case are not being disputed. Mr. Bradley admits that he brought a gun on campus and that he had previously brought a hunting rifle and ammunition on campus. The Administrative Hearing Officer has recommended that Mr. Bradley be suspended without pay for 90 days rather than terminated. Superintendent McKinzie has recommended termination. This is an employee who knew that guns and weapons are prohibited from campuses yet brought them anyway on several occasions.

Kevin Postin Cox, Attorney for Mr. Bradley, stated the issue is whether the Board should accept the Administrative Hearing Officer's recommendation or the Superintendent's recommendation.

Dr. Reddout commented that there were 24 Findings of Fact by the Administrative Law Judge, one of which is opposite of what was presented by the Superintendent's counsel.

Mr. Bridges reported that the legal issue of being in possession of a firearm is not before the School

Board; it is the Board's policy that no guns are allowed on campus and whether having the gun on campus justifies termination.

Mrs. Lofton commented she would uphold Superintendent's recommendation. Staff are and should be role models for our students.

Mrs. Fields concurred.

Dr. Reddout does not feel that termination should be outcome.

Mrs. Sellers commented that students are suspended for one year by state statute. This teacher knowingly brought a gun on campus. It is the level of severity that warrants termination. We have to be role models for our students.

Mrs. Cunningham stated as responsible adults and educators we have to set example as role models for our children and students. We have to ensure the safety of our campuses. She will uphold the recommendation of the Superintendent.
