Minutes:

Youth in Government students from 7 different schools thanked the School Board for providing the program at their school that helped them feel comfortable speaking before large groups.

Christa McCullough spoke against arming teachers or staff.

Bob Nichols spoke against the Guardian program allowing certain staff to carry guns.

Bill Simpkins spoke in support of the Guardian program.

Sarah Fortney spoke against arming teachers and suggested inexpensive security measures to use instead.

John Ruffin praised Superintendent Byrd for taking a stand against having staff armed on school grounds.

Fred McNair stated God needs to be a part of all decisions; no guns are needed.

Marianne Capoziello stated guns are not an option; teachers are to teach not carry guns.

Lisa Galvin spoke of training needs for those who care for our special needs.

Larry Milhorn thanked Superintendent Byrd for attending all three in-service trainings for school bus drivers; he also spoke against arming staff on campuses.

Eddie Hall reported funding is available to train those who care for special needs students through Disability Rights.
