Kelly Pietrodangelo explained she feels her son is not being adequately served as an ESE student and that his Individual Education Plan (IEP) is not being properly implemented.

Larry Milhorn, President of the local American Federation of School, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), discussed the District's fund balance and encouraged the School Board Members to budget for employee raises and step increases. He also commented that employee raises have not kept up with the inflation rate which as resulted in the depletion of employee savings accounts.

Marianne Capoziello, President of the Polk Education Association (PEA), discussed the upcoming administrative hearing regarding the negotiation impasse on May 11th and 12th. She stated she would like to see the School Board discuss contract obligations. She commented on the need for prioritization and the finite amount of money available. She also discussed non-categorical funds that could be moved and the urgency of maximizing all of the money that comes through the district.
