Mr. Townsend asked what the purpose of the additional enrollment is. Superintendent Byrd commented the school is rolling up a grade level from the ninth to the tenth grade. Mr. Townsend asked what the consequences would be if the request was denied. Wes Bridges, Counsel for the Board, commented that a denial could result in a dispute that could be heard by an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings if the requesting party chose to pursue it.

Mr. Harris stated it is important for the community to know the School District has already funded and built sufficient student stations to accommodate the students. He also commented this is an unnecessary increase in charter enrollment at a charter school when there are empty student stations at Tenoroc High School.
