Associate Superintendent of Operations Greg Rivers reported that, given our limited funding, staff determined the best solution to address the current overcrowding and new growth taking place in the northeast area is to build a 1400-student station, K-8 school in the Four Corners area (north of I-4 and Highway 27). The new site would help with the overcrowding at Loughman Oaks Elementary and the new growth. The school should be completed in August 2017.

Mr. Rivers reported that Horizons Elementary was selected as the site for a 22-classroom wing because it has sufficient core facilities (cafeteria, media center, etc.) to handle the additional 440 students. The new wing will help reduce the overcrowding at Eastside and Alta Vista as well as assist with the new growth in the Horizons Elementary area. The new classrooms should be completed by August, 2015.

Mrs. Cunningham reported that growth and overcrowding is prevalent in the northeast area. She commented that any property owner or developer with land available for a new school north of I-4 should contact the school district.

- An Algebra 1 program for 1000 students who did not pass the End Of Course exam.
- A prep program for the SAT, ACT, and PERT college readiness assessments.
- And, the AMP Academy (Accelerating Maximum Potential) for Grades K-6 funded through Title 1 to help students in the Turnaround Schools to advance to the next grade level.
