Minutes:

Mark Grey, Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, provided information on the major changes between the tentative budget draft presented at the June 2012 Work Session and the tentative budget to be advertised in the Ledger on July 28, 2012.

- 1. Decrease in Property values
- 2. FEFP increased to equalize with other school districts across the state.
- 3. Final conference report, discretionary lottery money has been eliminated (funds were placed in school recognition funds); equates to a \$578,000 reduction to schools
- 4. Carryover funds (estimated \$1,472,219) rolled into fund balance for reappropriation

Mrs. Wright asked for clarification on the discretionary lottery funds. The state placed the funds as School Recognition dollars for schools that made A or B or increased a letter grade. It is not anticipated that we will receive a large portion of the funds.

Mr. Grey clarified that the district isn't losing funds, but on how it can be allocated through Recognition funds - A,B and schools that increased a letter grade will receive funds. In previous years, Discretionary funds were given to all schools regardless of their letter grade.

Dr. Nickell stated that at the National College Board Conference, our school district was recognized as having the most significant forward movement in the nation for AP advancement for the under served populations. For the second year in a row we increased the number of students taking advanced classes and increased performance on the FCAT. This is remarkable progress.

Mrs. Sellers noted that the College Board recognition is a national achievement, yet it goes unannounced by the State and doesn't figure into our grade.
