She also reported that approximately one half of the students contacted have signed up and that 45-50 students have already received their scores required for the ACT. Minutes:

Ms. Matthews provided highlights on some main excerpts of upcoming projects within the 2015-2016 Audit Plan. Internal Funds audits, which are required by statute, are

contracted out to the CPA firm Carr, Riggs and Ingram, LLC. This is the second year they have done this and the second year that 100% of the schools will be included in the audit. Last year career center audits were added back into the plan which had not been the case for approximately five years. Theft and fraud investigations occur throughout the year with varied time involvement, as well as random payroll audits of schools and departments in an effort to test compliance with School Board Policies and Department of Labor Laws. Purchasing Card audits are performed to ensure compliance with policies and procedures as well as to avoid inappropriate expenditures. Reports are done for each audit performed and provided to the involved parties including the Superintendent and School Board Members. Construction projects are also being monitored by the same CPA firm. In addition, FTE audit checks have been added to ensure school level readiness for state audits and promote adequate record keeping. Ms. Matthews also outlined some ongoing staff duties such as staff training being performed by acting Senior Internal Auditor, Kandice Edwards and others.
