Mrs. Byrd recognized staff in the audience from McLaughlin. When she met with staff she did inform them that LSI would be their External Operator and they would be out this week for support. Lake Wales Charter was not qualified by the state to be an External Operator.

Mr. Townsend stated that we need to support each other, no one is better than the other, I will not support making McLaughlin a Charter.

Mrs. Fields told McLaughlin staff, she is behind them 100%. Mrs. Fields feels that LSI is well equipped along with the partnership of our team to do what is necessary.

Mrs. Reynolds, thanked the McLaughlin teachers who were present. She expressed appreciation for what they are doing. The state is very supportive of the Superintendent, principals, and LSI at your schools.

Ms. Fortney does not support this position at this time, however once it is voted on for approval, she will support. She feels we need to support our employees first.

Mr. Townsend stated that the Chief of Staff position will help our system work better and serve everyone better, a designated liaison. We will get criticism as to how this looks.

Ms. Fields explained that Mrs. Byrd always stated she wanted to get in the schools more to provide her expertise and knowledge to move the schools. This position supports and assists Mrs. Byrd to get into schools. If it does not support, we can go back in a year to revisit.

Ms. Fortney agrees with Mrs. Fields, however she feels that we are doing more with less. She stated that there are staff living paycheck to paycheck. We are losing veteran staff, it costs us money to train new incoming staff, etc. History has shown that once we get one of these positions, it is hard to get rid of.

Mr. Wilson stated they have had several discussions regarding this position. He would like to see a Chief Operating Officer to review processes and procedures to see where inefficiencies are and improve our district. We have a lot of staff with educational backgrounds, however, feels it would be helpful to have someone with a background in process to look at district from a big picture. Feels in the long run this will help free up some money for us to do other things, help our employees.

He reiterated on VAM equations and stated that it was discredited in 2014 by the American Statistical Association. He stated that it is a deliberate effort to disrupt and harm.

#### 52. SPEAKERS

#### Minutes:

Melissa Stump: parent, Carlton Palmore and Harrison, concern of food insecurity of students that are part of our school system. Some of our schools are practicing in the SHARE Program, which gives kids the food that isn't used to take home. I would like to see this become a policy at all schools.

Mrs. Byrd: We will try to push out SHARE Program county wide.

Kay Kasser: Combee Connection Ministries, through Highland Park Nazarene. Love to see what Mrs. Byrd does in county. She spoke on food insecurity and stated that the program delivers food to families. They have recently delivered to 25 families. Kids Pac is a great program, to help kids bring food home to others at home.

James Watkins: Offering his services, Bible Teacher, He would like the opportunity to teach new testament to our children.

Sarah Gant: Speech Language Pathologist, She stated that speech language pathologist staff are not given bonuses, namely the school improvement bonuses because they are

designated as District staff but have the same requirements that teachers do. Why don't we get rewarded when school grades improve. Why are we not rewarded? Other bonuses are also denied. We are also required to have Master Degrees and certifications.

Mr. Wilson asked to have this issue added to the next Work Session agenda for discussion.

Matt Ager: Painter from Bartow - He feels that they are the "bottom rung, afterthought, step children". He stated that all of the attention, budget, etc...goes to education. Without these staff, drivers, food service, maintenance, there is no school. Last year, he took a pay cut. We care about doing our job, people are afraid of speaking out, they end up leaving. Think about us, when you do the math.

Keith Lightsey: C-1 shop, painter. He has been in district 3 years and had high hopes to retire here. He works his second job on weekends to make ends meet. He feels that its wrong that they cant get raises but he see a lot of contractors for the things that he's supposed to do. However, he's been told that there is no money for raises. - please think of the smaller guys.

Margie Patterson: Vice President, Bus Attendants, AFSCME She has worked with PCSB for 30 years. Mrs. Byrd needs this chief of staff position but it is bad timing. There is so much that our schools need, we need help also. So many in this position want to walk away due to lack of pay.

Larry Milhorn: President AFSCME, spoke out against Chief of Staff position, timing for this position isn't good. He let Mrs. Byrd know that its not her fault because he knows that the legislature sends the money. Health insurance is in bad shape. That positions salary could pay for 4 or 5 custodians that could lower the square footage per custodian.

Stephanie Yokum, President of PEA: You have the power to do something about this. By 2022 we will not have people in these schools if we wait. People are leaving in droves as people can get more money somewhere else.

Randy Deitrich: He feels that there are problems that have to be handled right away. Certain things cannot wait years.

Bishop Mincey: We have so many problems that may be fixed at next election, people in Tallahassee need to go. Hire the Chief of Staff and we can see things getting done. Please go to the poles, the hearts of some of these people are not in right place. Be encouraged, don't give up. Victory is around the corner.

Danielle Mercer: Bus Driver, Stated that she loves what she does and the people she works with but she cant stay at her current position. But there is money for a new position. We should not have to work multiple jobs to take care of our families.

Darrell Robertson: Bus Driver, also came to speak out in opposition of new position,
