He stated that every student in America is guaranteed a right to privacy just as every parent has a right to access their students records they also have a right to privacy to others accessing those records. Therefore we cannot answer every question we may get in regards to other students. There will come a time that investigative reports that are not student records will be released and redacted to protect the identity of minors. We will be as open as we can. Anita Carson: Teacher, Lake Alfred Polytech - She spoke about the loss of units at Lake Alfred Polytech. Stated that this is not a Students First move.

Carson Witlock: Teacher, Lake Alfred Polytech also came to speak about the gains the students were making under the leadership of Ms. Julie Grice. They are now a C school for the first time in eleven years.

Indiana McGill: Reading Interventionist and President of PTO, spoke on her concern of the five units being cut at Lake Alfred Polytech and how poorly it impacts children when these changes are made.

Brandon Lane: works at Lake Alfred Polytech, spoke on the students at Lake Alfred Poly and how the change will effect them after losing five of their teachers.

Amber McCloud: Teacher, Lake Alfred Polytech also spoke on the five units that are going to be taken. Please don't hurt our community; we ask them to trust us, we ask them to believe in us.

Wendy Schmeling: Advanced Civics Educator, Lake Alfred Polytech - We are not receiving the

support in maintaining the school a passing school. We need your support to help make Students First.

John Van Volkenburg: Resident of Polk County, He is concerned about his son having a 2 hour ride on a school bus. He couldn't get anyone to answer phones in transportation nor was the principal on campus at that time.

Tracy Dannimiller: Spoke about the issue of her granddaughter at Medulla Elementary and her concerns about them still have not been addressed.

Brandon & Lauren Springfield: Came to address the Blake Academy situation with her child last week; zero tolerance is important in situations like this. She asked that we not stop fighting for the children and revisit our policies.

January Lacey: Stated that she has a 17 year old in our school system that has been bullied the last 5 years. She also said that she requested to see a video of when her son was beat up and was told that she was unable to see the video unless her son was the accused. She would like to see these policies revisited.

Kathryn Bates: Has two students that have been bullied and stated that it was never dealt with. What we have going on in our schools is insanity, we need accountability and sanity. Our students shouldn't go to school in fear.

Lowani Sanchez: talked about suicide rates are going up due to bulling situations that are not being addressed.

Bishop Mincey: Stated that he was taught by his parents that charity begins at home. That everyone has to take part in doing a good job with our children. This cannot be one-sided. So much is put out on social media and it is looked at one sided and we need to see the other side as well. We must support each other because these are our children. He asked everyone to come together for solutions.

Twanda Butney: Spoke about a shooting that took place outside her salon and while the seen was taking place. a bus driver dropped the students off during an active crime scene. A plan of action must be put in place for our children's safety.

James Williams: Would like to know how long an investigation take? Does privacy and accountability also extend to faculty and staff that were present at the time of the incident?

Mr. Bridges answered his question by stating that the rules for adults are different from students. When the investigation on the adult is complete, it will be a matter of public record; it will be reported and it will be public. Names of students will be retracted. Reports must be requested.
