Minutes:

Attorney Levi Williams representing Polk Charter Academy clarified both the operating structure of the charter organization and the joining of the two Boards: Florida Charter Education Foundation (FCEF) and Bay Area Charter Foundation, LLC (BACF). This structure is recognized by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and has been recognized by every other county where they have established charters. Charter Schools USA is an Educational Service Provider (ESP). He also identified the schools the group previously referenced as overcrowded as Sykes Elementary, Lakeland Highlands Middle, and Mulberry Middle.

Velora Cole, Vice Chairman of the Board, stated they ensure students have the support and academic resources as well as making sure the teachers are qualified and prepared. They also work on the development of community partnerships. They strive to meet and exceed the standards of the Florida Department of Education.

Minutes:

Mr. Small, Deputy Superintendent, has concerns that some of the overpopulated schools identified are two of the few middle schools that are not part of the turnaround option schools.

Melissa Brady, Director of Charter Schools, stated legal documentation has never been received to validate the attorney's statements regarding the merger of the entities in question.

Mr. Wilson stated the charter application is the basis for all information. He added there are still concerns with parent interaction.

Mrs. Sellers shared her concerns about the organizational structure as well as the lack of appropriate documentation from the applicants. She does not feel it will close the achievement gap or serve the diverse population it has stated. The lack of transportation is another concern.

Mr. Harris encouraged the community to spend time identifying why there are two corporate entities.

Mrs. Cunningham recapped the Board's areas of concern such as; failure to identify appropriate transportation, failure to provide evidence of rigor indicative of a Polk County Charter School, and failure to adhere to statute 1003.22 (9) regarding public meetings. She also commented the charter school appears to be governed and operated by a different entity than the one that submitted the application.

Mr. Berryman commented his concerns are that this charter applicant proposes a questionable location and will have no representation on their school board from Polk County.

Mrs. Fields stated there were too many questions left unanswered and no validation for this school in this community.
