She stated it is important for the students to have the social interaction, as well as a physical, emotional, and mental release.

Mrs. Fields responded that the Board will gladly be held accountable because they know the value of recess and they will work hand in hand with those concerned with this issue because they desire the same result.

L. D. Wilcox discussed civil citations, student suspensions, and the absence of black history in the School District's curriculum. He feels the Superintendent and Board Members continue to drag their feet in regard to these areas. He also feels the teachers are not adequately compensated for the hard work they do for our students. He congratulated Mr. Bridges on the award he received this evening.

Mrs. Fields stated that civil citations have been discussed previously and she would like to see it on the agenda, even if it is in a work shop to discuss the procedures and agencies involved.

Superintendent LeRoy explained civil citations are not a School Board decision to make and implement. This must be supported by the Sheriff's Office and State Attorney's Office. She shared that this subject and best practices around the state were discussed at length at the Florida Association of District School Superintendents (FADSS) conference last week.

She also explained history for black Americans is embedded in the State Standards and is a part of our curriculum.

Addison Brown congratulated Mrs. Fields on her chairmanship. He also discussed discipline statistics in the schools and the escalation that results with repeat misdemeanor infractions. He stated the School District does not want to implement conflict resolution programs.

Larry Milhorn, President of American Federation of State County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), reminded the School Board Members and Superintendent that the AFSCME annual Christmas party is this weekend. He wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a happy and safe holiday.

Dennis Leone expressed his frustration that the School District does not call it Christmas vacation rather than Winter Break. He stated this must be because the Board Members are atheists, Muslims or non-Christians. He commented that 90% of the nation calls it Christmas and this is coddling the other 10%.

Mrs. Fields addressed his concerns and asked that he not stereotype or judge the School Board Members and wished him a Merry Christmas.

KimMarie Noble discussed the Recess Committee and pending recommendations. She asked the School Board not to wait to see what Tallahassee does. She understands there are mandates in place but they can be worked around. She said Physical Education (PE) is not the same thing and the data and research are out there to support this. She asked the Board to do the right thing and reminded them that the group that initiated this effort is not going to go away. She commented if 79% of the schools in our District have recess there is a way for 100% to implement it.

Mrs. Fields explained this subject had already been addressed and will be implemented in the fall of 2016.

Victor Chandler discussed the difference between individual raises and a raise in position.

Adjournment
