L.D. Wilcox welcomed the newly elected School Board Members. He discussed students in Polk County that struggle in homeless situations and commented that all children can learn. He discussed the importance that all children get the best possible education.

Cassie Gibson, a teacher at Haines City High School, congratulated the two new School Board Members. She also commented on her frustration with the ClassWallet program being used as a means to spend Teacher Lead money to purchase supplies.

Mitchell Ladner, the parent of a child at Brigham Academy, discussed his concern that his child's teacher will be leaving mid-year to accept another position. He commented the timing will affect student achievement and that the teacher should remain in her current position until a full time certified teacher can take her place.

Superintendent Byrd explained this matter has already been discussed with Carolyn Bridges, Senior Director of Acceleration and Innovation, as well as Teddra Porteous, the Associate Superintendent of Human Resource Services. They have determined the teacher will remain in place until a certified replacement has been hired.

Becky Troutman is also a concerned parent of a Brigham Academy student. She commented the teacher is amazing and she encouraged the School Board members to stay informed of what is going on in the schools. Without parent advocacy the class would likely have had an array of substitute teachers.

Bishop William Mincey discussed his appreciation for all that has been done in the School District. He commended the Superintendent for her involvement with students, teachers, and staff members and she continues to encourage and motivate everyone. He also commended Wes Bridges, Counsel for the Board, for the work he has done. He stated there are many challenges ahead, but the School Board must stay the course. He wished everyone a merry Christmas and a prosperous New Year.

Larry Milhorn, President of the American Federation of State, County, and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), congratulated the newly elected School Board Members. He also commended the Superintendent and the Board Members for attending the AFSCME Holiday Event. He wished everyone a merry Christmas and happy New Year.

Addison Brown commented on the large population of homeless students in Polk County. He discussed the turnaround schools and those schools that feed into them. He also commented on the Strategic Plan identified points of improvement.

Phil Pemberton commented the School District should begin psychological testing prior to age 8. He explained the reason is that children that have suffered any form of brain damage at birth are beyond the statute of limitations at age 7. This has had a large impact on his family.

Marianne Capoziello, President of Polk Education Association (PEA), commented on

teacher retention and salary progression. She also discussed the teacher frustration with the ClassWallet program.

Cary Zeller is a substitute teacher in Polk County. She commented the substitutes work with what they are given and it is a challenge filling in for teachers who have not left proper lesson plans, etc.
