Mrs. Cunningham commented on the recognition of Polk County administrators by the Florida Alliance for Arts Education:

- Brian Kier, Principal of Davenport School of the Arts, was named the Administrator of the Year.
- Beth Cummings, Director of Fine Arts, was awarded the Ace of Hearts award.

Mrs. Cunningham also commented on what a great event the recent Polk County School District Hall of Fame was. This is an opportunity for local valedictorians and salutatorians to interact with 3-4 former Polk County Students that are awarded and recognized for their lifetime accomplishments. Kudos to Leah Lauderdale for a great evening, and all of the effort, time and talent that was invested in the event.

She encouraged everyone to have a safe, happy summer and to spend time reading.

Minutes: Mrs. Fields also expressed her thanks for the work Superintendent Byrd has done with the school based administrators.

Minutes: Mr. Wilson acknowledged Mr. Harris for his recent induction as President of Florida School Boards Association.

Minutes: No report this evening.

Public Comments Addressing Items Not on Agenda

101. SPEAKERS

Minutes:

Freddie Mitchell shared his thanks to the Polk County School Board. His family has been an active part of the District for many years in many capacities. Florida is the number one stressed state in the Country, which equates to parents, teachers, students, and administrators that are the most stressed in the nation. He proposed a way to alleviate this by integrating various methods for a stress free workplace. One way to accomplish this is a ten minute break per day which reduces stress 30-70%, as well as diabetes.

L.D. Wilcox discussed the number of Superintendents that have been appointed in recent years. He stated the District owes it to the children to provide a high quality education or they should remove themselves from the system. He commented on racism, nepotism, and buddyism and that there are still too many students leaving our schools and going into the penal system. Our young people are crying out for help and our system needs to move forward.

Dr. Faye Bellamy, of the Concerned Citizens group, discussed her concern about the revision of the strategic plan. She saw an article about this in the Lakeland Ledger stating the Board had changed their priorities in a single meeting. The Concerned Citizens group was once in mediation with the Department of Justice but opted to participate in the Strategic Planning process instead.

Mrs. Fields stated that what was discussed at the School Board Retreat was merely a shift in points of interest in order to improve academic performance. She also commented the Board will not be throwing out the works that were done previously.

Bishop William Mincey stated God will allow this District to come to the top. He gave special acknowledgement to Superintendent Byrd for the encouragement she has given to the new administrators in order to ignite the spark in them. He explained the District must be proactive instead of reactive for the common goal of making all Polk County students successful. Every student has this potential no matter what path they take to prosper; college, workforce, etc. He encouraged the Board Members to stay the course and keep the students foremost in their actions.

Addison Brown discussed the School Board's proposal to pursue 5 specific goals that was discussed in the Lakeland Ledger. He reiterated to the Board the importance of increasing

graduation rates and decreasing drop out rates. He continues to advocate for black history as a part of the class curriculum. He also commented on the detention rates and the removal of out of school suspension as punishment.

Victor Chandler discussed teacher salaries. He presented the Board with an illustration of what step increases would look like if the Board Members received pay increases on the same type of salary schedule the teachers have.

Marianne Capoziello, President of the Polk Education Association (PEA), stated it is time to move forward with negotiations again. She is concerned that an external source from a legal firm in Tallahassee will be a part of the process. She stated the Board must prioritize salaries up front. If the District wants the best and the brightest instructing students and increasing academic success, consideration should be given to adequate compensation. The stress levels being experienced by the teachers could be lessened by providing adequate pay as well as meeting needs such as classroom supplies.

Nicholas Poucher, Senior at Polk Collegiate High School, commented the Polk County School Board is superior to many other districts. He recently received his private pilot's license from the Central Florida Aerospace Academy (CFAA) and next year he is on track to graduate with a high school diploma as well as an Associate's Degree.
